## Pupil Premium Impact 2015/2016

During the year we spent £36,800 in the following ways:

Emotional support through activities such as Play Therapy, Drawing and Talking etc

Free places at breakfast and after school clubs

Free lessons to learn a musical instrument

Personal resources and equipment

Free places on trips and additional activities such as sports clubs

Additional adult support for enabling greater progress in reading

Additional adult support within classrooms to support learning

ICT equipment and resources to support learning

Contribution to operational costs of mini-buses

Teacher observations and parental feedback showed generally high engagement in learning with positive well being of the pupils.

Across the whole school 33% of pupil premium children met the expected standard for the combined expectation in reading, writing and maths. (60% whole school)

62% achieved the expected standard in reading, 52% in writing and 43% in maths.

The increase in average points scored over the year for the group was slightly lower than the overall school average but all pupils demonstrated progress across the year in all subjects.

At the end of Year 6 in 2016 33% of eligible children sitting the national curriculum tests reached the expected standard in reading and maths with 50% in writing.

75% demonstrated progress above the national average in reading, 50% in writing and 25% in maths.

The previous year saw KS2 value added in all subjects broadly average or above. From 5 out of every 6 starting points, the proportions of pupils making and exceeding expected progress in reading, in writing and in maths was similar to that of other pupils nationally. Also, the proportion of pupils that attained at least level 5 was equal to or above the national figure for other pupils maths.
