## Absence and Late arrival at school

From January 2023 any pupil that arrives in school after 9.00 am will need to be signed into school by their parent/carer. In addition anyone leaving school early will need to be signed out and medical slips will be required to support dental/GP/hospital appointments.

Reminder that school gates open at 8.50 am and children must be in class by 9.00 am. The registers are open until 9.30 am and anyone arriving after this time is marked as "U" late after the register has closed. If we do not hear a reason for absence registers are marked as "N" until we hear a reason. If we do not hear from you within 2 weeks the absence will be changed to "O" unauthorised absence. A build up of unauthorised absences can result in a fine from KCC. Reminder that medical appointments wherever possible should be made outside of school hours. No absence during term time is permitted for holidays.

It is essential that if your child is absent from school for any reason that you contact us as early as possible. Thank you.

#### Parking outside of school premises

Today we have received another complaint from a resident of Peter's Village regarding parking outside of school. Whilst we appreciate that Worrall Drive is really busy at school drop off and collection time, please be courteous to the residents and please park sensibly (not on curbs, and not near the island crossing).

In addition, parents who do not have a car park token will not be granted access to the school site and entry will be refused . Sadly we have noticed an increased number of parents not supporting us with this school rule by

tailgating other cars or approaching the gates expecting to be buzzed in. This puts our children at risk. Tokens are

issued for staff and allocated to families/pupils with specific needs or

circumstances. Thank you for your support on this matter. It is important that we all work on this together to ensure the safety of all.

<u>Walking bus</u>—if anyone can help re start the walking bus from either Wouldham Rec or Peter's village please let us know. There are training courses, and support along the way and this might help reduce the amount of cars needing to drive and park at school.
