WORSHIP

This week during worship we have been exploring the theme, 'Forgiving others as God has forgiven you'. On Monday we looked at words of wisdom from the bible linked to our theme and heard two thought provoking stories. One of these stories was taken from the bible, about a king who forgave his servant of a large debt that was owed to him, but this very same servant was unable to forgive a very small debt that was owed to him. Consequently, the unforgiving servant was thrown into prison! If we don't forgive, it can often mean that we too become prisoners – prisoners to anger and bitterness. Reverend Mike came in to lead his final worship on Tuesday and recalled a moving, real life story of a mother's forgiveness, which highlighted the amazing fruit that comes from forgiving others – both for the one giving and the one receiving forgiveness. On Thursday, we discussed how difficult forgiveness can be and looked at a strategy to help us with this. We had a great time during our Praise worship on Friday and also celebrated St Patrick's Day!! We learnt that St Patrick was taken from his home at a young age, brought to Ireland and forced to become a slave; escaped six years later; decided to forgive his perpetrators and after becoming a bishop, returned to Ireland to preach the Good News of Jesus - what a miraculous story!! Memory verse of the week: 'You must forgive one another, just as the Lord has forgiven you' – Colossians chapter 3 verse 13.
