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School Performance 2019

Schools have certain performance elements that are recorded and able to be compared to other schools. Our details for 2019 are below:

Children achieving expected standard in grammar, punctuation & spelling by end of Year 6	58.3%	77%	78%

Children take tests at the end of Year 6 which are marked with a scale score. A score of 100 marks the expected standard and 110 has been deemed to indicate a higher level.

Children deemed to have a higher level of reading	22.2%	29%	27%
Children deemed to have a higher level of writing	13.9%	23%	20%
Children deemed to have a higher level of maths	13.9%	27%	27%

Schools are also awarded progress scores to show how children have developed from the end of Year 2 to the end of Year 6. A score of 0 shows progress in line with children around the country who had similar starting points. A negative score shows children make less progress than others and a positive score shows children make better progress than all other schools with similar starting points.

Note - The school began the year (September 2018) with 244 pupils but finished in July 2019 with 361. This means that only 68% of the children in the school had been with us for a period of more than one year. A significant number of these additional children are reflected in the above figures and this should be taken into account when making comparisons with the Kent and National figures.
