

<u>Furthering our Learning</u>

Spellings and Home Learning...

Monday – Weekly spelling test and new spellings set.
We practise our spellings at school, but children should also practise spelling the words at home to achieve their best possible score. If a child scores full marks for three weeks in a row, they will be rewarded with a golden ticket!

Wednesday – 'Home Learning Challenge' hand in day. These will be related to our topic, and are intended to be challenges for children to enjoy! One task per week is expected to be completed; please encourage your children to complete these tasks. Not handing in their challenge will mean that your child does not earn all of their Golden Time on a Friday.



Reading...

We would really like every child in Robin Class to read aloud daily to an adult. This can be recorded in their reading record with any comments. We are really focusing on asking questions to check children's understanding of what they have read; asking your child simple questions about what you have read together would certainly help with this.

We expect children to bring their reading books and reading records into class every morning as this will enable us to see how often they read as well as reply to any notes you may have written.

Library Visit...

Once a term, Robin Class have the opportunity to visit Strood library. Children should bring their library card to school and any books that need returning. A text message will go out each term to let you know the date of our library visit. If you have books to return but it is not your child's week to visit the library, books can be put into the return box in the office foyer.

Rewards...

In Robin Class, exceptional effort is rewarded in different ways.

Golden tickets are awarded for amazing work or contributions to lessons that make us say wow! These can also be earned by getting full marks in spellings for 3 weeks in a row. Every ticket is put into the golden bin and on a Friday afternoon, one lucky person's ticket is picked out, and they can choose their prize from the treat box.



Dojo points are awarded for many things, including handing in reading records, reading at home, sharing of ideas, working hard, and being ready to learn. At the end of each term, the 3 children who have been awarded the most Dojo points will win a special prize.
