Spelling pattern and any rules	<p>Words ending in –ous (S46)</p> <p>Sometimes the root word is obvious, e.g. poisonous.</p> <p>Sometimes there is no obvious root word e.g. tremendous.</p> <p>-our is changed to -or before adding -ous Keep the final e when using a soft g.</p> <p>If there is a short i sound before the suffix -ous, it is usually spelt with an i, but a few words have e.</p>	Words with the k sound spelt ch (S48)	Words with the sh sound spelt ch (S49)	<p>Words ending with –cial and –tial (S54)</p> <p>-cial is common after a vowel, and –tial after a consonant, but there are some exceptions.</p> <p>Exceptions: initial, financial, commercial, provincial</p>	Words ending –ough (S59)	Words with silent letters (S60)
