Monday 11 th January	Today you are going to think about your opinions from Friday and use them to write a book review of 'Beegu'. Remember when you write a book review you give your opinion of the story and whether you would recommend it to others. If you would like to be really creative make your own template.
Tuesday 12 th January	Today we are going to be thinking about Beegu as a character. Re-read the story and think about how Beegu feels throughout. Think about describing words which we call adjectives. There is a Beegu outline on the website page or you can draw your own, then write the adjectives to describe her inside. Wednesday 13 th January	Can I re-read what I have written to check that it makes sense? Close your eyes and imagine the world where Beegu comes from. This is called a setting. Can you describe it to your family? What would the sky look like? What will the landscape be? What might you see? What might you hear? What colours would there be?	Can you draw and describe the setting of Beegu's home on purple mash? Don't forget what you learnt yesterday about adjectives to put into your sentences. Think about what you described orally.
Thursday 14 th January	Today you are going to re-read the story and think about retelling the story. You will be doing this by freeze framing where you act out part of the story and then freeze. Get an adult to take a photo and guess what part of the story you have frozen in frame Don't forget to use facial expression and body posture to show the viewer what you are thinking - without words. Can you add a caption to your freeze frame?	Freeze frame part of the story and then get an adult to guess which part of the story it's from. Take a photo and add a caption to tell us which part it is and either add it to the blog or send it to our purple mash email.
Friday 15 th January	You are going to create your own story map of the Beegu story today. Think about what happened in the story in order and draw your own story map on the purple mash template.	Remember to complete your story map you can draw a picture of each part of the story along the s of your story map and add key words to each part. You can either do this on paper or on the blank purple mash template by drawing a big s.
