Furthering our Learning

Home Learning and Spellings...

In Magpie Class, children are given homework once a week, on a Friday; to be completed by the following Thursday. Homework should not take more than 20-30 minutes to complete and will alternate between an English and Maths focus. The homework consists of three main tasks: revision of what they learnt in the previous week; reinforcement of what they learnt that week and preparation for what they're going to be learning the following week. Also included on the homework sheet is the spelling pattern and new vocabulary for that week. Please encourage your children to do the homework. Children unable to complete the homework are asked to complete it during Golden Time on a Friday.

Reading...



There is an opportunity for children to read every day, both independently and as part of guided reading. Please do your best to encourage your child to read for pleasure at home on a daily basis.

They're never too old to be read to, which is why we also have daily story time.
