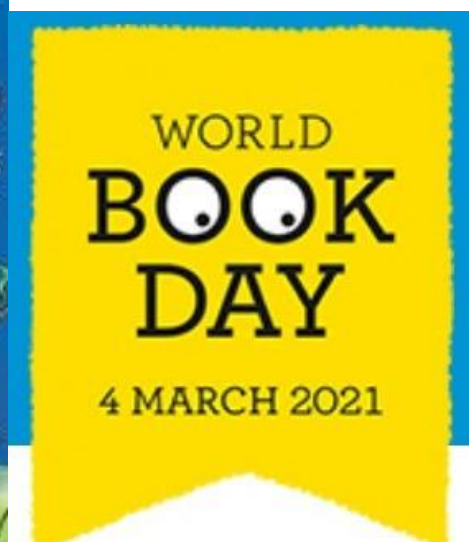
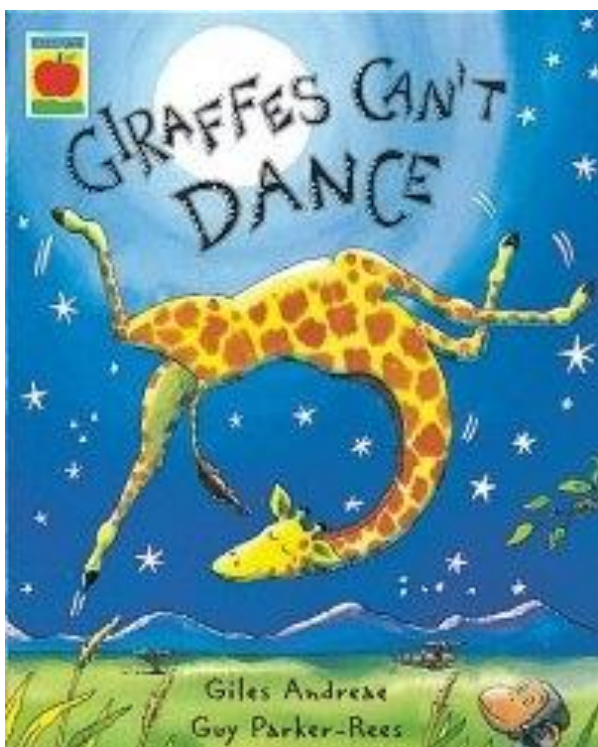






Week 2: Theme 'Out of Africa'
